

SAFETY MANAGEMENT COURSES

Maritime Safety

Management System Awareness

To introduce the concepts of mandatory and recommended safety management systems in the marine industry. It covers requirements from the International Safety Management Code, Domestic Safety Management (MGN 536), Code vessel and requirements under the Intended Pleasure Vessel Code and those of Small commercial vessel and workboat codes.

Duration: 1 day

Certification: Course Completion Certificate



Maritime Designated Person

To introduce the concepts of the responsibilities for a Designated Person within a safety management system. It covers requirements from the International Safety Management Code, Domestic Safety Management, Code vessel and Class vessel requirements: knowledge and understanding of the ISM/DSM Code; mandatory rules and regulations; applicable codes, guidelines and standards; assessment techniques of examining, questioning, evaluating and reporting; technical or operational aspects of safety management; knowledge of shipping and shipboard operations; participation in a Management System Audit; effective communications with shipboard staff and senior management.

Duration: 2 days

Certification: Nautical Institute Designated Person



Maritime Lead Auditor

To introduce the concepts of the requirement

of internal and external audit of safety management systems in the maritime industry. It covers requirements from the International Safety Management Code and Domestic Safety Management and includes: auditing techniques and processes surrounding ISO 19011 plus the management of an auditing program.

Duration: 2 Days if following the DP Course
